Thank you.

What kind of questions? Like...

Me ROSELINE OUELLETTE:

The question about the interpretation of the bylaws.

Me PIERRE-LOUIS FORTIN-LEGRIS:

Okay.

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- Q- What do you know about the relation between Madame Beaumont -- Ms. Beaumont and Mr. Altalibi?
- A- That they're friends.
- Q- Okay, do you know something more than that? How is their friendship?
 - A- Apparently good.
- Q- Is there something else in their relation that could explain this particular point here?
 - A- I can't say there is. Friendship. They had a close relationship, that's all I can say.
- Q- Okay. But did you know that before June nineteenth (19th) or June twentieth (20th), when this resolution was passed?
 - A- I don't believe so, no.
 - Q- Okay, the motion -- there is a few -- there is a lot -- being resolved to that, pending this resolution, and these -- this -- the "be it resolved that" -- they impose a limitation on Ms. Beaumont's ability to represent D.S.U. at any meeting -- at any CFS-Q meeting, or CFS-Q National -- or CFS National.

How does the Executive Council find its power to impose this non-behaviour to Ms. Beaumont?

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- A- "Find its power"?

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Can you find us where in the Constitution?

Me ROSELINE OUELLETTE:

We don't have any example of the Constitution here, and I will not allow him to interpret bylaws or -- of the Constitution.

Me PIERRE-LOUIS FORTIN-LEGRIS:

So, I will ask you the same thing on the power to -- the last "be it further resolved", that says that if Ms. Beaumont doesn't comply with this resolution she can be stripped of her duty as V.P. External by a two third (2/3) vote of the Executive Council.

Me ROSELINE OUELLETTE:

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And your question here is...?

Me PIERRE-LOUIS FORTIN-LEGRIS:

It's where in the bylaw we find...

Me ROSELINE OUELLETTE:

o Objection.

Me PIERRE-LOUIS FORTIN-LEGRIS:

... this power to strip her of her duty?

U Can you take an undertaking to give us the actual version of the Dawson Student Union...

Me ROSELINE OUELLETTE:

Yes.

Q- Do you have access to that?

A- Not on me, but I can have...

Q- Okay.

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A- ... someone e-mail it. 🕙

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O- Perfect.

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Me PIERRE-LOUIS FORTIN-LEGRIS:

Yes.

Me STÉPHANE ROY:

I think it's a good thing to clarify that, anyway, for everyone.
